## Indonesia-Korea relations & the Human Dimension

\* 'golden period'

\* 'human dimension': migration of people

 Korean investments to Indonesia 'Korean boom' started in early 1990s.
1,500 Korean companies & 45,000 Koreans The largest foreign community in Indonesia.
Indonesian migration to Korea, mostly workers The first arrival in 1993

Indonesians now over 400,000 The 5th largest foreign group in Korea

\* Implications: Beyond G to G, People-centered relations

ASEAN as a major power for Korea

#### People

- Putting people as the highest goal
- Sociocultural and people-to-people exchange
- People-oriented, people-centered approach

3P Principle of NSP

#### Prosperity

- Mutually beneficial economic cooperation
- Dropping mercantilist approach
- Enhancing ASEAN Connectivity

#### Peace

- Political and security matters
- Peace, rather than security
- ASEAN-Korea, to build peace in the region

## **People-centered Relations?**

- 1) Mutual visits
  - (Key indicator for performance check: 15 million in 2020)
- 2) 2-way cultural exchange
- 3) Human resource development
- 4) Enhancing governance (including civil society networking)
- 5) Protecting rights of people (including supports for ASEAN people in Korea)
- 6) Better quality of life

(including cooperation on public health)



### **People-centered relations = Regional partnership for the SDGs.**

## Healthcare & welfare research cooperation

- Thai experiment towards universal healthcare coverage for 17 years. The infant mortality rate is decreasing drastically.
- Indonesia is chasing Thai for universal healthcare coverage.
- Vietnam also reveals relatively nice performance in healthcare
- Healthcare reform in Southeast Asia provides exciting and dynamic examples
- It's the time to make Korea-Japan-ASEAN cooperation for healthcare and welfare studies
- Target: SEASIA Conference 2021, maybe in Indonesia



## Indonesia-Korea Solidarity for Better Democracy

- Democracy as a common value between Indonesia and Korea.
- Blueprint for 'Indonesia Democracy Foundation'
- Cooperation with Korea Democracy Foundation (KDF)
- Civic education, research, archive and exhibit on the history of struggle for democracy and human rights
- "A path toward democracy" = remembering the dark past and marching for the future
- "Melawan lupa" activism
- Memory of the Reformasi -> Reformasi Jilid Dua.
